



Doug Weaver '72 was a three-sport letterman at GHS in wrestling (3 years), football (2) and track (3). In football Doug obtained All-County honors and captained the team in his senior year. The team record was 12-5-1 during his two years as a letterman.

Doug shined on the wrestling mats, experiencing early success as Greenville's first Junior Olympic champion in 1969. He scored a Section 3 title as a junior, and went on to Section, District 10 and Regional championships as a senior. His bid for a state title ended in the finals, losing a hard-fought battle to finish runner-up.

Doug was a co-captain of the Trojan mat men his senior season when they finished undefeated as a team. Doug finished his senior year with a 24-1 record and went 55-4 overall during his high school career. The Trojan team was 13-1 and 14-1 his junior and senior years with Bill Shimshock, Mike McGonigal and Weaver finishing their regular seasons undefeated. A 30-15 win over the rival Reynolds Raiders highlighted the season for the Trojans. Doug and McGonigal were named co-recipients of the Rodney K. Wentling Award following the season.

Doug received a full wrestling scholarship to Penn State (1973-1976). He finished runner-up at the NCAA Eastern Regional Wrestling Tournament in 1975, qualifying for the NCAA Division I Wrestling Tournament. His junior year Doug had a dual meet record of 5-5 and went 3-2 in the NCAA tournament. Doug lettered at PSU in 1973 and 1975. He was a member of USA Wrestling from 1995-2010 and was inducted into the Mercer County Hall of Fame in 2017.

Doug remained active coaching wrestling at all levels from 1989-2007. He coached two high school state champions from 1989-1991 and assisted during his son, Luke's wrestling career, where he finished as an Idaho state champ twice and runner-up once. Wrestling success truly runs in the Weaver family.
