



**Dr. John Scullin** was one of the top all-around athletes to come out of Greenville High School in the late 1950s. He was a standout in football, basketball, and track for the Trojans from 1958-61. In 1960 he was named All-County First-Team at running back. In 1961 he was named Greenville High “Best Male Athlete.”

John went to Cornell University, Ithaca, New York where he shined at defensive back as a member of the football squad from 1961-65. He won defensive player of the game honors as a starting defensive back from 1963-64. He also played lacrosse in 1962 for the Big Red. He was a starting running back on the U.S. Navy All-Star team vs. a Japanese college All-Star team in a game at Tokyo Olympic Stadium. He graduated from St.

Louis University School of Medicine in 1969, playing rugby for the St. Louis Bombers Rugby Club while there.

Dr. Scullin has served as team physician at Greenville High since 1976, in addition to serving as a team physician for Thiel College. He was a former team physician and orthopedic consultant for Slippery Rock University and is a member of the Cornell Football Association. John was enshrined in the Mercer County Hall of Fame in 2009.

Dr. Scullin lives in Adamsville with his wife Marguerite. They have 5 children and 12 grandchildren. He lives by this statement: “Day by day, in every way, with God’s help, we try to do better and better.”
