



Faith Ann Miller is a 1965 graduate of West Middlesex High School and a 1969 graduate of Slippery Rock State College with a BS degree in Health, Physical Education, and Recreation. She taught Phys Ed at Greenville from 1969 to the spring of 1976, returning as an aide in the fall of 1989. She began teaching Media Production classes in the fall of 1998, continuing until her retirement in Jun of 2006.

Faith Ann started two different women's sports teams at Greenville. In the 1971-72 school year, she started modern era (5 on 5, all players playing full court) basketball as an inter-scholastic sport after two years as an extramural team. Over five seasons, her teams posted a won-loss record of 39-38.

In the spring of 1980, Faith Ann began the volleyball program. In 19 seasons spread over a period of 26 years, the team went 217-127, won three Mercer County Athletic Conference (MCAC) championships, qualified for the District 10 tournament 10 times, and had four players named league MVP, two of them twice each. In that time there were 13 players named MCAC first-team all stars, five made All District-10 teams (two twice each), and one received All-State mention.

Faith Ann was named the MCAC Volleyball Coach of the Year in 1984. She coached four young women who preceded her into the GHS Athletic Hall of Fame – Christine M. “Tina” Bonci '72, Colleen (Currie) Taylor '86, Laura (Beatty) Bullock '90 and Pualani Spurlock-Welsh '93.

Faith Ann is the mother of Ross Miller, currently of Pittsburgh, and the wife of retired GHS English teacher Paul Miller.
