



Jesi (Christiansen) Andolina, class of 2003, is one of the most decorated athletes in Greenville High School history. She lettered four years in cross country and track, setting numerous records along the way.

In cross country Jesi was the Mercer County Athletic Conference (MCAC) Meet Champion (1999-2002), District 10 Meet Champion (1999-2001) and runner-up (2002), and placed first (2000-2001), second (1999) and sixth (2002) in the PIAA State Meet. She was named to the MCAC All-Conference first team (2000-2002), All-State Cross Country (1999-2002), GHS Cross Country Outstanding Varsity Girl Runner (1999-2002), GHS Leadership Award (2001), and the GHS Trojan of Integrity and Valor Award (2002). Jesi

was undefeated in all GHS cross country meets with the exception of one District 10 meet and two PIAA meets. Nationally she was recognized as a Wendy's High School Heisman National Nominee (2003).

On the track Jesi dominated distance events for four full years. In her best event, the 3200m run, she finished first in the MCAC and District 10 meets for four straight years and finished first (2000 and 2001), second (2002) and fourth (2003) at the PIAA State meet. In the 1600m run she finished first (2000, 2001, 2003) in the MCAC Meet, second (2000, 2001, 2003) and third at the District 10 Meet and eighth (2001) at States. She led the 3200m relay team to three first place MCAC Meet finishes (2000, 2001, 2003), two District 10 titles (2000 and 2001), sixth place (2001 and 2003) and eighth place (2000) at the State Track Meet.

Jesi set new school records in the 1600m (5:07.7), 3200m (10:53.66) and as a member of the relay team (9:40.9). She received many track awards including: GHS Most Valuable Female Track Athlete (2000-2003), GHS Trojan Pride Award (2002), Pittsburgh Tribune-Review YMCA Scholar Athlete Award (2003), and MCAC All Conference Team in four events for multiple years. During the years 2000 - 2002, the Lady Trojans went 35-0 in dual meets.

Jesi moved on to Wheaton College (IL) where she participated in cross country (4 years) and track (4 years) while obtaining a BA in Communications (2007). While there she was a National Qualifier for the Division III Cross Country National Meet (2003 and 2004), track team captain (2006 and 2007) and the cross country team captain (2007).

Jesi placed in the Top 5 female runners in The Pittsburgh Steeler 5K four times and was the Mercer County Twilight Quad Road Race Female Champion from 1997 to 2003. She still enjoys running and competing in road races in Tennessee where she lives with her husband and son and coaching a homeschool cross country/track team since 2008.
