



John Prebula (Class of 1966) participated in track and basketball, lettering three years in each sport. He was one of Greenville's most prolific scorers on the basketball court, achieving high scorer honors in his sophomore, junior and senior seasons. He held the men's all-time scoring record at Greenville at 1,157 points for 52 years until it was broken by Joe Batt in 2018. John's record was prior to the three-point shot being installed in the high school game.

John was honored with a UPI 3rd Team All-State selection his senior season. That season, under Head Coach Bob Fagley, the Trojans posted a 20-2 record, splitting games with Mercer County rival Hickory and the Slippery Rock Rockets to finish runner up in the county conference. The Trojans also won the Reynolds Invitational Christmas Tournament that year with

John and Tom Breckenridge being named to the All-Tournament Team.

Following high school, John attended the University of Maryland where he graduated with a BS in Mechanical Engineering. He played basketball for the Terrapins from 1966 through 1969 seasons, before an accident damaged both ankles in May 1969 ending his college basketball career.

John recovered to play recreationally and coached basketball for many years. He worked 42 years for Bechtel Power Corporation, retiring as an Engineering Manager (Professional Engineer - Mechanical Engineering) in 2013. He worked in nuclear design and nuclear licensing. For two years he was stationed in Knutsford, Cheshire, England where he coached the town's recreation league team from a near perfect losing season the first year to a near perfect winning season the following year.

John and his wife, Carol, have three adult children. He is active in his Punta Gorda, FL community and enjoys playing golf.
