



Kenneth A. Scott '64 was a three-sport athlete at Greenville who went on to play football at the University of Tennessee. After attending Reynolds as a freshman, Ken participated in football, basketball and track as a sophomore and senior. His junior year was interrupted due to injuries received in an accident.

Ken made the most of his senior year on the football field when he led the 7-2 Trojans to a shared Mercer County Class A Championship. As a running back he scored 116 points and ended the season as first team All-County and Honorable Mention All-State selections. Ken also lettered in basketball and track his senior year, but football was where he excelled.

Following graduation Ken received an offer to play football at the University of Tennessee. Freshmen were not eligible for varsity at that time, so his first year playing was as a sophomore in 1966. Ken started his career at wingback as freshman but played as a sophomore on defense at the “monster man” position. Per the Volunteer Sports Information Department, the NCAA did not keep official defensive stats until the 1970 season, so totals were unavailable. He played in the fourth quarter of the opening game vs. Auburn. Tennessee won 28-0. He also played in the fourth quarter of the second game of the season against Rice.

Injury and family obligations cut his career short at Tennessee; however, the coaching staff issued the following accolades in the 1966 program:

“Another determined young man who came along fast in spring practice by giving maximum effort in every workout....Split time between monster man and wingback, indicating he will be valuable reserve in either capacity...rated by coaches as one of most improved Vols.”

Ken retired from a teaching career at Meadville School District and currently resides in Springboro, PA.
