



**Steve Riley '75** was one of the best all-around athletes to walk the halls of GHS. He was a three-sport performer, excelling in wrestling, football and track.

On the mats Steve was the first two-time state champion from Greenville, notching Class B titles in 1974 (185 weight class) and 1975 (Unlimited). He was a 3-time Regional Champion, also winning several District and Section titles. He was named an All-American in wrestling following his senior season.

Steve also excelled in football (1971-1974) and track and field (1972-1974) for the Trojans. He was named All-State Honorable Mention in football in 1974 and was All-Mercer County on both offense and defense. The Trojan football team went 17-1 his junior and senior years. Steve won a state medal in the shot put and was a Greenville school record-holder in the event.

Steve received numerous scholarship offers from the likes of Pitt, Purdue, Ohio State, Kent State, Arizona State, Alabama and West Virginia. Ultimately, he chose to stay close to home studying at West Virginia and East Stroudsburg College before beginning a career as a master builder.

Before leaving the Greenville area for the British Virgin Islands in the late 1990's, Steve coached baseball from T-ball through Senior Division and umpired girls' softball. He also starred on local and regional slow pitch softball diamonds for many years, wreaking havoc with many an outfielder.

Steve was inducted into the Mercer County Hall of Fame in 2019. He lives in his house named "The House of the Rising Sun" on Great Camanoe, British Virgin Islands.
